

Accomplishments 2010-2015

- **30 health and social service establishments** in Québec supported in their patient partnership efforts
- **1,400 students/cohorts/year in 14 health and psychosocial science programs at the Université de Montréal** trainees over 3 years in collaborative practices in partnership with patients and families (CSS 1900, 2900, 3900)
- **8 CIHR networks** supported in their implementation of a patient partnership strategy
- **Canada Research Chair** on partnering with patients and the public

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- **30,000 health and social services professionals and managers** sensitized to the notion of patient partnership across Québec, North America and Europe.




PATIENTS OF ALL AGES (20 to 80 + yrs)
